to Woman's Aid, hosting safety events with local services, running painting classes, organising litter picks, and supporting apprenticeships for care-experienced young people.

- Hope 4U: Energy bill support, supplier issues, fuel vouchers (when available), and grants for energy-saving upgrades.
- **Citizens Advice** Bureau (CAB): Welfare and money advice, legal aid, debt help, and energy guidance. The Mitchell Library office also offers Blue Badge services.
- **Jobs & Business** Glasgow: Help for homeowners returning to work, including job search and skills development.
- **Enable:** Employability support for disabled clients.
